Featured Speaker:

Our speaker this month was Dr. Pragati Pradhan presenting "Animals and Astronomy." Dr. Pradhan is an Assistant Professor in the Department of Physics and Astronomy at the Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University. She completed her post-doctoral research at MIT and Penn State University. Here research focuses on the high energy emissions from cosmic objects such as neutron stars.

Dr. Pradhan discussed case studies of how some animals use astronomy in their everyday life and how human technology, such as spacecraft design and navigation, borrow structural features from animals.

Dr. Pradhan gave numerous examples of animals using astronomical information in navigation – including birds, jumping spiders, harbor seals and dung beetles. She also discussed how we can use information from animal strategies in designing future technology such as robotic vision and complex image processing.

Humans can also help animals by employing new technologies such as using astronomical software to locate and track endangered animals. At the conclusion of her talk, Dr. Pradhan fielded a number of questions regarding her primary research on pulsars.
