Featured Speaker:

Our speaker this month was Dr. Nick Moskovitz of the Lowell Observatory presenting a follow-up discussion of NASA's first planetary defense experiment (DART mission): "The Earth Strikes Back." This is a follow-up to an earlier talk by Dr. Moskovitz exactly one year ago.

Dr. Moskovitz divided his presentation to address three fundamental questions:

- 1. Why did we do DART?
- 2. What happened?
- 3. What are we learning?

The DART vehicle impacted the smaller member of a binary asteroid. The mission was considered to be a great success in that the impact changed the orbital period of the target body by half an hour. As with any successful experiment, it raised several open questions that are being studied:

- Why does the post-impact target body show 2 tails?
- What caused brightness changes over various timescales?
- How long will there be a tail?
- Did Dimorphos get re-shaped by the impact?
- What does Dimorphos look like now?
- Is the binary orbit stable post impact or is it changing?

The HERA project, a companion mission operated by the European Space Administration, is planned for 2026. HERA will study this asteroid system with a variety of instruments.
